ECONOMIC EFFECTS



of a nation lies in the hands of its people, which is why it is appreciated when people from different places and knowledge come and contribute to the nation.



INDIA'S PRESIDENCY

G20 or the Group of 20 is an annual summit formed in 1999. The G20 was established as a platform for the Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors to discuss international economic and financial concerns. It is conducted with a rotating Presidency in charge.

It includes the European Union as well as 19 other nations including India, Germany, Argentina, Canada, Australia, Brazil, China, France, Indonesia, United Kingdom, Italy, Republic of Korea, Mexico, Russia, Japan, United States, Turkey, South Africa, and Saudi Arabia. These members contribute to nearly two-thirds of the world's population, over 75% of global commercial activity, and 85% of the world's GDP.

There are two simultaneous programmes at the G20: the Finance Track and the Sherpa Track. Sherpas are in charge of the Sherpa Track while the Finance Track is led by central bank governors and finance ministers.

23 years after the formation of G20, on 1st December 2022, India took over from Indonesia as the G20 forum's president, making it a historic day. The

G20 presidency of India, which has the largest democracy and the fastest-growing economy in the world, will be essential in building on the noteworthy accomplishments. The Maha Upanishad, an ancient Sanskrit scripture, serves inspiration for the G20 theme of "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam," which translates to "One Earth, One Family, One Future," during India's presidency. the Amrit Through

The logo: The radiant hues of India's national flag—saffron, white, green, and blue—were used as references for the G20 Logo. Planet Earth is distinguishable by the lotus, the national flower of India, symbolizing development over adversity. The Earth reflects India's pro-planet ideology of living in total coherence with nature. The word "Bharat" is written in the Devanagari script beneath the G20 symbol.

Kaal programme, India is on a quest to create a shared global future for everyone. India seeks to advance a rules-based system, peace, and equitable progress for everyone while also having a strategy defined and development-focused approach. The six main goals of India's will G20 leadership be strengthened by the 200+ events scheduled in the run-up to the 2023 Summit.

The six main targets are:

1. Green Development, Climate Finance & LiFE:

A top goal for India's presidency is addressing climate change, with an emphasis on energy transitions for developing countries worldwide as well as climate financing and technology.

The problem of climate change affects each business, field, and community. As a result, India offers the world LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment), a behaviour-based movement that draws on the rich, long history of sustainability of the country to encourage consumers and markets to adopt environmentally friendly habits.

2. Accelerated, Inclusive & Resilient Growth:

Sustainable development depends on rapid, robust, and inclusive growth. India, during its G20 Presidency, intends to concentrate on sectors that possess the ability to bring about fundamental change. This includes a desire to encourage trade for growth, advance labour rights and ensure worker welfare to solve the global skill gap and develop inclusive agriculture value chains and food systems, among other things the G20 presidency will provide a thrust to the system and processes.

3. Accelerating progress on SDGs:

India intends to concentrate on renewing the G20's commitment to achieve the goals outlined in the 2030 Plan of Action for Sustainable Development.

4. Technological Transformation & Digital Public Infrastructure:

India might highlight its commitment to a human-centred view of technology and promote greater knowledge exchange in key areas like financial inclusion, digital public infrastructure, and tech-enabled growth in industries spanning from farming to education.

5. Multilateral Institutions for the 21st century:

India's another top objective at the G20 will be to maintain pressure for multilateralism reform that builds a multipolar global framework that is more responsible, inclusive, fair and democratic.

6. Women-led development:

India aims to utilise the G20 summit to emphasise inclusive expansion and advancement, with women's representation and empowerment at the centre of India's G20 discussions. In order to further socioeconomic growth and the fulfilment of the SDGs, this involves an emphasis on elevating women into prominent roles.

In conclusion, the G20 holds considerable significance for India due to its economic size, regional influence, and global aspirations. India's involvement in the G20 enables it to shape international economic policies, advocate for its developmental priorities, enhance its diplomatic engagements, and contribute to global solutions for pressing challenges.

Crème Brûlée Recipe

SHOHAM KHANDEKAR

Crème Brûlée is a classic French dessert, with a smooth custard base topped with a caramelized sugar crust. Originating from France, this indulgent treat has captured the hearts of dessert lovers worldwide. Here is the recipe to make one yourself!

Steps:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 150°C (300°F)
- 2. In a bowl, whisk together the egg yolks and sugar until binded well.
- 3. Heat the heavy cream in a saucepan over medium-low heat until it simmers. Remove from heat.
- **4.** Gradually pour the hot cream into the egg mixture, whisking continuously.
- 5. Stir in the vanilla extract.
- **6.** Divide the custard mixture into ramekins or oven-safe dishes.
- 7. Place the ramekins in a baking pan and fill the pan with hot water half-way up the sides of the ramekins.
- **8.** Bake for 40-45 minutes until the custard is set around the edges but still slightly jiggly in the center.
- **9.** Remove from the oven and let the custards cool. Refrigerate for at least 2 hours.
- **10.** Then afterwards, sprinkle a thin layer of granulated sugar over each custard and caramelize the sugar using a kitchen torch or broiler.
- 11. Then serve and enjoy the creamy and caramelized delight of Crème Brûlée!

Ingredients:

4 egg yolks

1/4 cup granulated sugar, (plus
extra for caramelizing)

1 and 1/2 cups heavy cream
(whipped cream)

1 t<mark>easpoon vanilla extract</mark>
