## MICROSOFT VISIT

Mr. Ryan Stroyan, Industry Business Head, Asia and Ms. Ritu Gulati from Microsoft visited Suncity School on 3 May 2019. Students of Grades II-X spoke about the uses of Microsoft tools done in our classes. A presentation for the same was also shown simultaneously as the students spoke.

Mr. Ryan was very impressed with the progression displayed by our school students where the use of Office 365 was demonstrated by a Grade IV student and then by Grade VIII student as well according to their level. 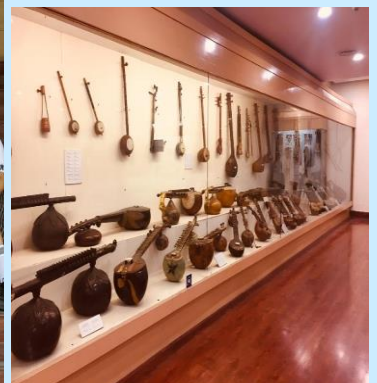

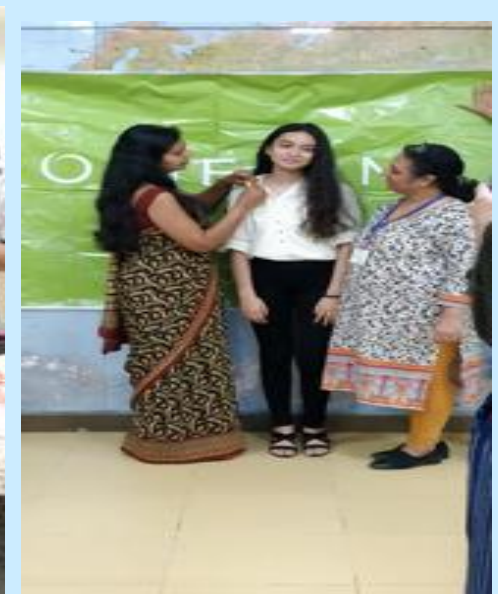
The students were provided training in the following areas -
