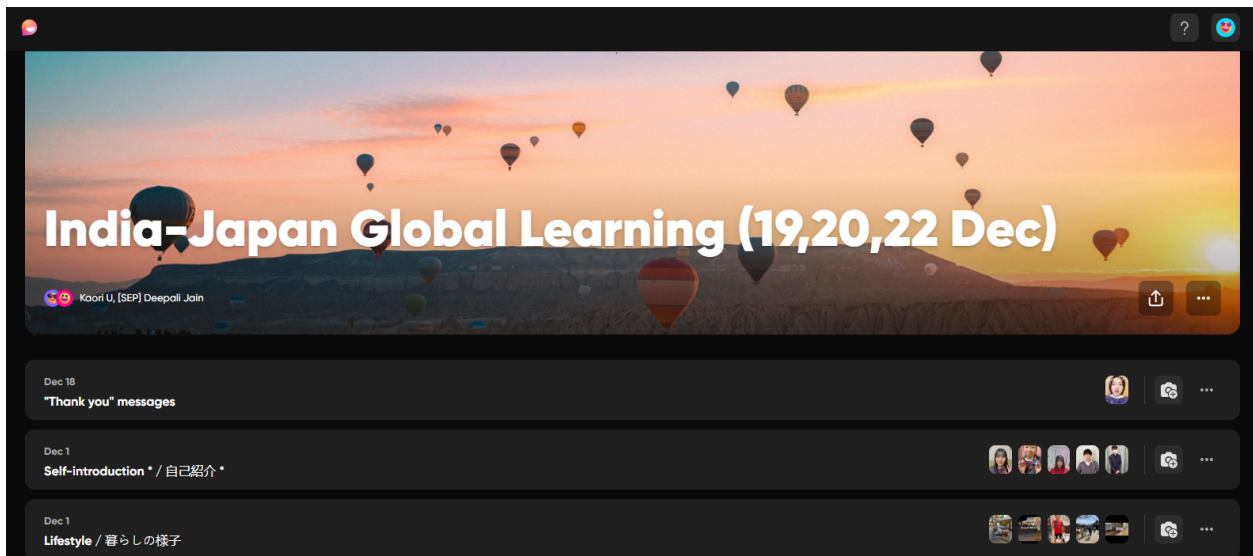


## SHIN Global Collaborative Learning Program

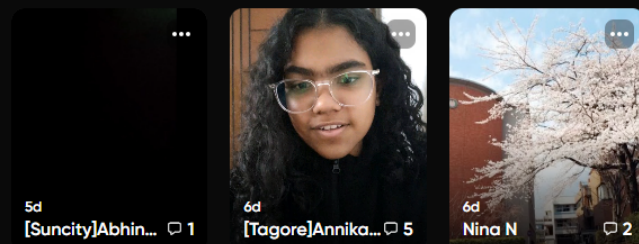


